9/5/2023 Old Times by Harold Pinter

A stunning drama critically hailed as this Nobel Laureate's most important play. Time, space, and memory are explored as we delve into the past and present lives of three people.

10/3/2023 According to Goldman by Bruce

Graham A screenwriter-turned-professor finds himself in an unorthodox collaboration with a student, while his wife struggles to define their evolving relationship.

11/7/2023 Mrs. Farnsworth by A. R. Gurney

A lighthearted piece about a Connecticut wife and mother who intends to pen a tell-all book about President George W. Bush with whom she has shared a shady past.

12/5/2023 Angel Street (Gaslight) by Patrick

Hamilton Murder and mystery loom in the air in this classic Victorian thriller. A woman who fears she is going mad suddenly realizes insanity is not her biggest threat.

1/2/2024 The Birds by Aristophanes

A 414 B.C. comedy dusted off to include current references. Two movie moguls abandon an increasingly vain and shallow society, wandering into the desert to live among the birds.

2/6/2024 Gidion's Knot by Johnna Adams

A grieving mother and an emotionally overwhelmed primary school teacher have a fraught conversation about the tragic suicide of the mother's son.

3/5/2024 Women Doing...Shakespeare

Excerpts from Shakespeare's lesser-known plays, with all the drama, humor, and intrigue found in his more popular plays!

4/2/2024 Love and Baseball by Jerry Montoya

Intelligent, humorous, and loaded with fun. Sparks fly but love and baseball are sports of luck, skill, and timing.

5/7/2024 Oleanna by David Mamet

A college student accuses her professor of sexual harassment. Voted one of the "10 best plays of 1992" by Time Magazine, this drama still holds relevance today.

6/4/2024 The Squirrels by Robert Askins

A boundary-pushing, darkly satirical look at wealth inequality. Also, you can watch actors play squirrels.

7/2/2024 Murder at the Howard Johnsons

by Ron Clark and Sam Bobrick Is all fair in love? Even murder? A light and funny suspense comedy about a love triangle in a Howard Johnson Motor Inn.

8/6/2024 Ghosts by Henrik Ibsen An intense, witty and concise adaptation of this harrowing and thrilling 1881 classic which generated strong controversy and criticism and is now considered a play that historically holds a position of immense importance.

MAINSTAGE

9/22 - 10/1/23 The Originalist by John Strand

A liberal Harvard Law School graduate discovers Supreme Court Justice Antonin Scalia to be both an infuriating sparring partner and an unexpected mentor. This critically acclaimed drama depicts passionate people risking heart and soul to defend their version of the truth. Set in 2012.

11/10 – 11/19/23 Three Viewings by Jeffrey

Hatcher Three comic/dramatic monologues set in a midwestern funeral parlor over a three-day Christmas weekend. Emil, the mild-mannered undertaker; Mac, a beautiful Los Angeles drifter who steals jewelry from corpses; and Virginia, the widow of a wheeler-dealer contractor who has left her in debt to the banks, her family, and the mob.

1/12 – 1/21/24 Mere Mortals by David Ives

Six short comedies from the playwright of "All In The Timing". This critically acclaimed evening of laughter combines satire, wit, hilarity, and intellect—a winning combination.

3/15 – 3/24/24 Moscow Moscow Moscow Moscow Moscow by Halley Feiffer

Ever since their brother gambled away the family fortune, Olga, Masha, and Irina have been doomed to the boredom of the Russian countryside and hope, one day soon, to return home to Moscow and live the exciting lives they were meants to live. A contemporary twist on Chekhov's *Three Sisters* wherein a delightfully dysfunctional family navigates the absurdity of class, culture, and love.

5/31 – 6/9/24 Grand Horizons by Bess Wohl

Bill and Nancy want a divorce fifty years into their marriage. While they seem unfazed by the decision, their family is forced to reexamine everything and grapple with their new reality. A clever truth bomb of a play that is extremely funny, while also asking a few tart questions about comedy itself.

7/26 – 8/6/24 District Merchants by Aaron

Posner Love, loss, litigation, and predatory lending are examined in surprising ways in this uneasy comedy, which wades fearlessly into the endless complexities and contradictions of life in America. Set among the Black and Jewish populations of an imagined time and place that is simultaneously Shakespearean, Reconstruction-era, Washington, D.C., and today. District Merchants is a remarkable tale of money, merchandise, and mercy.
